COVID-19 Visitation Policy and Procedure -

TITLE: COVID-19 Visitation

EFFECTIVE DATE: 11/12/2021

PURPOSE:

To provide residents with the ability to visit with loved ones in a safe manner during an epidemic.

POLICY:

- 1. Visitation is now allowed for all residents at all times.
- 2. Visitors who have a positive viral test for COVID-19, symptoms of COVID-19, or currently meet the criteria for quarantine will be denied entry to the facility
- 3. New Vista Center strongly encourages all visitors to become vaccinated for the safety of our Residents and Staff.
- 4. All visitors will be offered to take a COVID-19 test at the facility when they arrive.
- 5. Upon arriving at the facility the visitor should use alcohol-based hand rub. All visitors will be checked for a fever, screened for signs & symptoms of COVID-19, logged, & informed of all the information regarding the visit and asked to sign an informed consent form.
- 6. Upon the completion of being screened and approved to visit the visitor should go directly to the resident's room or designated visitation area.
- 7. Visits should be conducted in a manner that adheres to the core principles of COVID-19 infection prevention and does not increase risk to other residents.
